Pastor's Pen with Pastor Kirkland



Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed;

for the Mighty One has done great things for me,

and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him

from generation to generation.

-Luke 1:48b-50

The stories, scriptures, and traditions of the Christmas season have been passed down to us throughout the generations. Many of us enter this season with many memories and emotions as vast as the cultural and religious rituals this holiday season holds. We can imagine the Christmas season is like a tapestry woven throughout time. And this Christmas tapestry weaves us in - to remember how God has shown up in the past, to continue the work of collective liberation, to behold the presence of God present among us.

Mary speaks the words above from Luke 1:48b-50 in her song of protest and praise known today as "the magnificat," which in Latin means "my soul magnifies the Lord." Mary sings her song despite the challenges and vulnerability she faced because she could glimpse the scale and scope of the good news she was part of bringing forth.


This good news transcends time and space - it was and is bigger than just her. Christ is coming for collective liberation: God's redemption is at work for years to come. Therefore, the promise is meant to be lived out and passed on from generation to generation.

As we journey our way through Advent toward Christmas, we encourage you to pay attention to each of the characters in these familiar stories and wonder: What did each person pass on or contribute? How did they either participate in God's liberation and love - or try to thwart God's justice? What can we learn from them, and what is our role now? What will we pass on to the next generation.

In worship and small groups we explore these questions, which come the "From Generation to Generation" sermon series and materials provided by the worship collective A Sanctified Art. This series reminded me that the root word of "generation" is "gen" meaning "origin" or birth." This series theme is also a call to action: What are we being called to generation or bring forth? What have our ancestors and those who have come before us passed on for us to continue? Who are the spiritual elders in our community who planted the seeds for the things that are now blooming? And what seeds are we planting for the future?

"From Generation to Generation" is an opportunity to remember the ways our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together. The word of God is always unfolding - in and through us. This Advent, may we remember that we belong - to a treasured and ongoing story, to generations that have come before and will come after, to a love that won't let us go.

The Girl Scout troops from St. Francis donated their time and energy on November 6 cleaning out the


CUMC Vegetable raised garden beds and squash garden. Their efforts are much appreciated. We look forward to them returning in the spring to plant the gardens.

Hospital Visits from a Pastor or Care Visitor

Please call the church office day or night if you want a visit. There is always a minister on call.

If you are at Olmsted Medical Center, a simple phone call from the patient, family member or staff person to notify us is all that is needed.

At Mayo Clinic Hospital, there is a process that goes as follows.

- Step 1. The patient, family member or staff person calls the church to make the request.
- Step 2. A pastor, staff member or care visitor will contact the nursing station with the name of the person who will make the visit.
- Step 3. The name is reviewed by the patient's healthcare team.
- Step 4. If approved, the Christ UMC representative makes the visit.

Note that a patient is only allowed a total of five visitors while hospitalized. It must be the same five visitors. Substitutions are not allowed.

Getting to Know Your Care Visitors

Care Visitors (formerly Parish Visitors) have been a key component in providing caring visits to Christ UMC members, friends and guests for five years. They call on people in the hospital, rehab, senior residences and homes. They call on people going through difficult times. They undergo monthly education and supervision. Please call the church office to request a caring visitor. They offer a listening ear, prayer, anointing and/or communion. Mostly they are a caring reminder of God's love.

Jeff Ward



"The First Advent in Palestine" will also be discussed during in person CU Wednesday Crossroads conversations for adults on Wednesdays from 6:30-7:30pm.


