Pastor's Pen with Pastor Jenny



There are stories that every family tends to tell whenever they get together- reliving memorable moments or laughing over an event that went awry. One of our favorites involves an overnight journey from Maryland to upstate New York for Thanksgiving, when we stayed awake by binging episodes of Serial and were fueled by Tim Horton's coffee and sheer stubborn will. I'm still not quite sure how we did it.

These kinds of family lore are usually based in some kind of real experience, but tend to shift a bit over time with each retelling and recollection. And sometimes events happen that entirely change how the story is told, or why it's no longer shared.

That's a bit how families themselves are to tell the truth. There are behaviors and experiences and emotions we carry through the generations, but there are also subtle changes and major milestones that can dramatically alter the trajectory of our family dynamics.

In that spirit, we wanted to begin this new year by digging into some of the family dynamics that come to us through the stories of the Bible.

Spoiler alert: these are complicated stories about complicated people. Not all of them are pretty and some of them are downright disturbing. There has never been such a thing as a perfect family and the biblical ancestors are no different. And any of us can probably bear witness to the pain and the joy that families can still embody for each other.

Our hope is that by exploring some of the family dynamics reflected in these ancient stories, we'll find some common ground that helps us recognize God at work in our modern family relationships and human choices.

You'll find the overview of the worship series inside this issue of the New Spirit. Stay tuned for opportunities to participate with further conversation, learning and even family photos. Feel free to invite neighbors, friends, or extended family members to share in worship with us in-person or online. United Women in Faith Sunday and our Annual Meeting will both take place within this worship series and should be wonderful celebrations of our church family as well.

I don't know if the holidays have left you longing for more time with family, or desperately hoping for quiet solitude, but either way, know that you are welcome and a beloved part of God's family. Blessings on your new year!








Be the Spark






Ellen Webb joined CUMC on December 11, 2022


