# Pastor's Pen with Rev. kirkland Reynolds, executive pastor

Never underestimate the appeal of a jar opener.

That's just one of the many good things we learned through CUMC's presence at Rochester Pride 2022.



Church members greeted attendees of Rochester Pride by affirming LGTQIA+ persons and allies while also handing out free "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors...and Open Jars" jar openers. Most people did not expect to be offered a free jar opener, but nearly every person happily said, "Yes please, I need one!"

That's grace: finding exactly what you need, especially when you weren't expecting to find it. And that's a life modeled by grace: offering gifts to people exactly where they are.

For many years the people of The United Methodist Church have called ourselves a church with open hearts, open minds, and open doors. This motto of openness has served as a rallying cry to how we conduct ourselves within the church and a promise to the world we strive to love and serve.

There is so much brokenness, suffering, and pain today. We may be entering another wave in the covid-19 pandemic. May 25 marks the 2nd anniversary of George Floyd's killing in Minneapolis. War continues in Ukraine. 19 children and 2 adults were killed in their school in Uvalde, Texas by an 18 year old.

Remembering incidents of gun violence in the US, David Leonhardt writes in The New York Times: "The list from just the past decade includes supermarkets in Buffalo and in Boulder, Colo.; a rail yard in San Jose, Calif.; a birthday party in Colorado Springs; a convenience store in Springfield, Mo.; a synagogue in Pittsburgh; churches in Sutherland Springs, Texas, and in Charleston, S.C.; a Walmart in El Paso; a FedEx warehouse in Indianapolis; a music festival in Las Vegas; massage parlors in the Atlanta area; a Waffle House in Nashville; a gay nightclub in Orlando, Fla.; and a movie theater in Aurora, Colo."

Friends, I will be honest with you. All this tragedy is exhausting and at times seemingly endless. Every time I learn of another experience of human suffering I say that my heart breaks. But after my heart breaking so many times, I sometimes wonder if there's anything left to break the next time.

We need God. This is always true. We need God, and we need each other. Our life together as a congregation affords so many opportunities to receive and offer grace. Because what we need - what the world and the church needs - is grace, as well as strength, resolve, and hope.

This New Spirit newsletter is filled with opportunities to experience grace through church gatherings, worship services, being present in the surrounding community, learning something new, and meeting others' needs through service. I hope something in this newsletter will help you offer grace to others and help you make time to open yourself to the grace God offers you.

Because, honestly, grace is just like a jar opener: when we are offered it there's nothing else we can say than, "Yes please, I need it."



#### Christ United Methodist Church Finance Report

Christ UMC continues to be in sound financial condition.

#### **Operating Budget Summary**

<sup>\*</sup> These results include unrealized net losses of \$38,144 from our investments with the Dakota-Minnesota UMC Foundation. Excluding these Total Income would be \$450,829 and Net Income \$102,045.

#### Assets and Liabilities

At the end of April, the church had cash and other marketable assets of \$972,240 of which \$669,741 was unrestricted, enough to fund 6.8 months of budgeted expenses. Our objective has been to be between 3 and 6 months, but we continue to believe that given current economic conditions a more conservative approach is appropriate.

Liabilities were \$302,499 of which \$286,128 were in restricted accounts contributed by the congregation for specific missions and projects. The largest of these include:

\$89,856 in bequests received by the church and controlled by the Trustees. Because of their restrictions they have been placed with the CUMC Foundation for management. The Foundation's total portfolio at the end of March (the last month for which data is available) was \$787,769.

\$54,661 in the Makinen Bequest account. The Makinen Bequest provided the seed money from which Thrive! arose, what remains may be used as the Leadership Board and congregation determine our needs.

\$23,862 in the Saturday Noon Meals account. \$10,000 of this has been earmarked for necessary upgrades to the kitchen exhaust hood.

\$20,000 to be used by Leadership Board as they assess future needs.

\$15,239 in the Music Ministry account.

\$8,534 in the Capital Campaign account which will be used for HVAC repair this year.

The church has no long-term debt.

#### Care for persons in the Hospital

Mayo Clinic Hospitals now allow two visitors per patient. You may choose to have one of your pastors be one of the two visitors.

Staff, friends or family need to call us and let us know of your request. There is always a minister on call, including nights and weekends. Just follow the instructions on the answering machine at church.

You need not be a member of Christ UMC to request a visit. Our guests may also request a pastoral visit.

The medical team can authorize a pastoral visit if a patient is experiencing a medical emergency. This request needs to have the pastor's name entered in the record for us to gain admittance.

In addition, you may ask to have your name on the prayer chain or in the bulletin. You may request communion, anointing, a handmade prayer shawl.

If you are at Olmsted Medical Center Hospital, you may also call us for a visit.






