Children, Youth and Intergenerational Ministries Schedule

Mini Mission Review - Our mini-mission team had a fantastic 30 hours of fun, service and building relationships. As we started our time together, 5 of the 6 youth admitted they were there because of parental pressure. At Thrift on 5th and Feed My Starving Children, we learned about how different organizations work together so resources are put to the best possible use. We offered a worship service for seniors at Madonna Towers and mulched, sang and worshipped alongside adults with different kinds of disabilities in the Centennial Flames group. We have already hatched plans to bring a similar experience to people in our own church. A highlight was trying new foods at the 98 Pounds Chinese Buffet and seeing a different kind of youth room. The six youth who attended are ready for their next mission trip, and next time will go because they had fun learning, serving and laughing together!

ASP Informational Meeting - The 2023 Appalachia Service Project is in the early planning stages. Join us on Sunday, September 18 at 6pm. In 2023 we will travel July 1-10 and have space for up to 18 participants. In addition to participating in training and fundraising, each youth will need to pay \$500 and each adult participant will pay \$150.

Mayo Hospital Visitor Policy

Mayo Hospital Visitor Policy and Pastoral Visits: Mayo patients may request a pastoral visitor as one of their five visitors during their stay in the hospital. It needs to be approved by their healthcare team, and needs to be the same five visitors during their entire stay. You can't take one off and add a different one. If you want one of the Pastors or Care Visitors to visit, please call the church office (or have another person call) to find out which one of us is available. We will then call the nursing station where the patient is located and it will be reviewed.

Olmsted Medical Center Visitor Policy: please call the church office to let us know if you want us to visit.

We do not know you are in the hospital unless you or a family member or friend notifies us. We want to pray for you and your loved ones.

Caring Conversations:

Caregiving and Resources in Our Community



There are many different types of caregivers in our communities. Examples include: family members/friends, daycare providers, group home staff members, in-home care providers, assisted living staff members, teachers, social workers, clergy members, nutritionists, patient care assistants, respiratory/ physical/ occupational therapists, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, doctors, etc.

On Thursday, September, 29th, from 6 pm-8:30 pm, the public is invited to attend a gathering at Christ United Methodist Church, Rochester, MN., on caregiving and resources in our community.

Sponsors include Christ United Methodist Church, AARP of MN, National Patient Advocate Foundation/ Patient Advocate Foundation, Family Service Rochester and Age Friendly Olmsted County.

Please join us as we begin to address caregiver needs in our community. There will be an opportunity to explore a Resource Fair and talk with political candidates and incumbents after a panel discussion.

Topics for the panelists include: What can be done to improve caregiver's experiences? How do we address caregiver burnout? Low wages? Staffing shortages? What is the financial impact of being a caregiver? Is there a need for Paid Family Caregiver Leave? What resources are available?

Any individual running for public office in Southeastern Minnesota with their name on the Nov. 8th, 2022 election ballot and incumbents will be invited to attend the non-partisan event to listen to a panel of caregivers sharing their stories and struggles through the years. There will be time for attendees to ask questions and share concerns.

A Caregiver Summit is planned for the early part of 2023 to discuss actionable steps to improve caregiving experiences in our community. Date to be determined. The public will be invited to attend.

There is no cost to attend these events. Invite your friends and neighbors. Refreshments will be provided.

Prayer Box

Give all your anxieties to God because Good cares for you. 1 Peter 5:7

Sometimes it's nice to have some help with your prayers.

When COVID sent Bob to the hospital with chest pain, dizziness, and shortness of breath, I was scared. They sent me home immediately, "Because you might have it, too." Ughhh! I felt helpless but not alone, having already texted my friend to notify Pastor Nancy. Soon afterwards, Nancy called me. She listened as I detailed my anxieties, my frustrations, and my wild imaginings. With permission, she also delivered a prayer shawl to Bob (who was still in the ER) and activated the prayer chain. Not that I regard my solitary prayers as puny. It's just that I felt puny in the face of events beyond my control. I welcomed the strong hearts of our prayer chain to help petition for Bob's well-being.

Another way to access our prayer chain is through the prayer box. We have a prayer box? Yes! During the pandemic, Jerry Blaisdell constructed a gorgeous wooden prayer box which resembles our church. The shape was Marjie's idea. It sits in the Commons atop the Welcome Center counter. Open the door to find paper and pencil. Jot down a first name and your prayer. Then insert it through the slit below the door.

When people who seem overwhelmed voice their concerns to me, I ask permission to notify the prayer chain. Two have said "Yes. Thank you." One declined on behalf of her husband, knowing that he wouldn't want the attention. I told her that I would include him in my personal prayers and she was good with that.

Bob is fine now. He protested at the time that the fuss was excessive, joking that I had dispatched the "Methodist Mafia" upon him. There may have been a chaplain visit, too. Or two. Both before he was discharged home from the ER. He wanted me to tell you that it actually felt really nice. I second that.

Our church does love as a verb very well. If you let them (us).







Why should I get vaccinated?

Influenza is a serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes even death.

An annual flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances that you will get the flu and lessen the chance that you will spread it to others.

Who should get vaccinated?

Although everyone who is at least 6 months of age should get a flu vaccination, at this clinic Hy-Vee is offering the vaccine to those over the age of 3 years.

Which vaccine is offered?

Hy-Vee is offering a quadrivalent injectable vaccine (ages 3 and over). The FluMist intranasal vaccine, if available, (ages 3-49), and a high-dose quadrivalent injectable vaccine recommended for those over the age of 65, if available.

Vaccine is FREE of charge for Medicare patients and is fully covered by most insurances.
