Many many years ago (twenty-eight, is that possible?) I was the mom of three pre-school children. I had just come back to Minnesota from a two year exile-feeling adventure called graduate school for my husband. We had lived in Pittsburgh and had landed a life in the holy land – Duluth.

After our second visit, the pastor called us. He wanted to know if he could come and pay a call at our home. We were happy to welcome him to our home, chaotic and child-run as it was. He had two young daughters, so we knew he would understand.

He came and visited and we enjoyed the chat time. And then, as the visit was winding down, he told us that a few days before his choir director had unexpectedly died. Was Jim interested in the choir director's position?

Well yes, he was.

So we continued our life as United Methodists. We were enfolded into that church and our children were loved and we were so very blessed.

I sometimes shake my head at the wonder of it all. We could have ended up in a variety of denominations.

We ended up United Methodist partially because of the Rev. Michael Wuehler.

Rev. Wuehler baptized our youngest son. His leadership and initiative continued me on the United Methodist way that led me to Christ UMC.

A random-feeling visit leads to much that could never have been anticipated, including the fact that I now serve the church from which Rev. Wuehler retired.

Who can know what the future holds?

In this season of Thanks Giving and preparation for the birth of hope, I am so very thankful to be in the midst of transformation in this place.

Truly.

On Sunday the 10th of December we will announce the total pledged toward the Transform campaign AND the program year budget. We will celebrate together by sitting at table and sharing wonder and gratitude.

Already we are so moved by the financial and soul commitment pledged to this church and its mission. Already I am grateful to my core for the heart and passion for ministry shared in and through this church.

Already my heart is singing such thanks.

I am a United Methodist pastor serving a church willing to share the joy and power of Christ Jesus in ways that transform lives.

Don't miss the December 10th celebration!!!!!! Together we create feasts of grace.





The Fourth National Climate Assessment (recently published) includes the statement:



The United Methodist Church Social Principals – Natural World - Energy Resources Utilization statement: "We call upon all to take measures to save energy. The deposits of carbon, oil, and gas resources are limited and their continuous utilization accelerates global warming."

There is a strong connection between the two statements above. There are also many things to do either individually or as a congregation. The Rochester Faith and Solar Coalition is undertaking an effort to increase efficiency in church buildings, and install solar panels on church buildings. Help is needed in many areas of the coalition. There are many hurdles to be overcome as existing laws, practices and opinions center around status quo. Individually, the Rochester Public Utilities Solar Choice program allows customers to participate in a community solar program even if their residence is not suitable for solar panel installation.

Sign-up for the RPU program ends December 31, 2017. There is an urgency for Creation Care!






