

"I pray you ARE savoring."

I am not sure how June became July, but here it is. Saddle up!

By the time you get this newsletter VBS will have touched the lives of nearly 100 people. The Appalacian Service Project crew (all 50 some of them!) will be on their way to ministry, and one third of precious summer will have been savored.

I pray you ARE savoring.

Even as the earth is bringing forth food, the groundwork for powerful discipleship is being undertaken here at church.

We're excited about rolling out this formula for living as followers of Jesus:

Worship + 2 + Tithe.

Let me unpack that.

Worship is our communal opportunity to gather to practice gratitude and seek sustenance for the living of our days. Living as followers of Jesus, we commit to gathering for worship weekly. I know, we can practice reverence for God on lakes and golf courses. Worship is different. Worship gives us a chance to pay attention to our hearts and our longings. When we come together to commune with God and one another, our very bodies change and our lives are transformed.

The "plus 2" means that we commit to two things:

One, we commit to being in a small group. Once a week we come together with others to learn, grow, and deepen. The meetings last one hour. The space will be held by trained disciples. The schedule will work for you.

Two, we commit to being engaged in (at least) one act of service on behalf of the church. Maybe we teach Sunday School or sing in the choir or answer phones or serve at Saturday Noon Meals. Surely we can do more than one thing, but we commit to witnessing to our discipleship in at least one way that supports the lives of others.

And the tithe? We commit to giving a percentage of our income to the shared ministry of our church. Together we can do so much. Your financial support buys Sunday School curriculum and gas for the bus. Your giving supports your staff and educates people in Africa. We know there are many places you could give and do give. We believe that your church touches lives in a way that is priceless and lasting.

So, think about how you will live Worship + 2 + Tithe.

And, pray this question:

God, what do you want to do through me?

We are readying for the vision-clarifying gift of a capital campaign. This campaign will be soaked in prayer.

God, what do you want to do through me?

From what I can see, God is doing a mighty work here.

Children laugh, elders are celebrated, and meaning is made. We live and love through the power of Christ Jesus.

Come to church this summer. We're just getting started in this circuit riding way of discipleship.

THRIVE! Update: Approval!

We will move forward with the creation of THRIVE!: A Child Care and Family Resource Center as a downtown missional outreach and will support an \$800,000 capital campaign to make improvements to our ministry plant to support THRIVE!, Sanctuary improvements and replacement of 8 window units.



Members voted at a church conference (May 31st), using identified ballot and completed ballots were collected by Leadership Board members. Two Leadership Board members counted the ballots in the presence of CUMC members. District Superintendent, Rev. Cynthia Williams announced the ballot tally: Yes: 110, No: 18, Abstained: 6, Total: 134, Approved by 86%. Praise be! The stats are glaring, and we're happy to transform according to the need! - According to a study, which was commissioned by Families First of Minnesota and United Way of Olmsted County, Olmsted County is short 1,855 child care slots of the expected need.
- The shortage of providers could pose economic challenges in a community that expects rapid growth in coming years. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates that in 2014, 74 percent of Minnesota households with children under age 6 had all parents in the workforce, the third highest percentage in the country.
- When families are able to find a child care provider, the costs can often be prohibitive. Minnesota has some of the least-affordable child care options in the nation, according to a 2014 study by nonprofit advocate Child Care Aware.

We're happy to announce that the search for a Music Director and Organist is over!





From the Ashes Recap






'20th Annual Pridefest July 21 to 23, 2017

Save the Date for the 50 Year Member Luncheon


