Pastor's Pen WITH ELIZABETH MACAULAY, LEAD PASTOR

Sometimes transformation is invisible. Subtle shifts move within organizations or souls. Without fanfare or overt signs, changes are underway.

The transformation going on here at church is not invisible.

Soon and very soon we will begin creating an excellent Child Care and Family Resource Center on the first floor of our building. We will be transforming a space that has represented some grief (what about all of those children who filled those Sunday school rooms back in the day? What has become of us?) into a space that represents new life.

Plans have been underway for two years for the walls (and asbestos!) to come down and for new life to be born in our building. Those charged with and willing to lend hours upon hours of planning and dreaming and praying time have done amazing work. The response of the Body of Christ here has been amazing. We are the people of Jesus the Christ who are willing to take our abundance and offer it in ways transformational.

So. Our entrances and exits through the lower level will be compromised during this time of construction. Please be patient with the process. Those needing accessible entrance to the church are asked to use the west entrance.

Christ UMC is making a profound shift in our ministry focus.

For many years, churches assumed that if they were attractional enough - had excellent choirs and children's programs and classes - people would engage and find relationship with each other and the Holy.

What vital faith communities are finding is this: People want to engage in ministry in meaningful ways. There is within the human soul a desire to serve and do rather than simply consume. For churches, that means that outreach in the community is crucial; not only for engaging people, but because Jesus teaches us that to live in his way we must be about the work of loving our neighbors as ourselves. Ministry is about engaging with what is and working for what can be.

We will run into bumps throughout the process of getting THRIVE! up and operating. There will be hard decisions to make and frustrations to deal with. Surprises are always part of embarking upon new life.

My deep conviction is that the way we encounter and deal with challenges is as important as the end "product" of our ministry. Trusting that God is in this, trusting that each and all have done their utmost to prognosticate and plan, trusting that God's promises of abundance are not mere platitudes but real, we move into transformation.

Take a deep breath, beloveds in Christ.

Transformation and resurrection are real.

On February 10th, we celebrated the 3rd anniversary of our arrival in Guatemala as long-term mission volunteers. Our time here has been filled with joys and sorrows, successes and failures, accomplishments and tasks yet to be completed. Sounds like life, doesn't it? Through it all we have been blessed and surrounded by God's presence! As the primary driver for volunteers, I drive the 15 miles from the town where we live to the clinic as well as making occasional trips to Guatemala City. Sounds simple, right? Driving here is full of challenges and dangerous situations. I try to start each trip praying that God will grant me three things:

To get all of us to our destination safely, to keep all those around us safe, and to help me make good decisions as we go. When you think about the <u>United Methodist Committee on</u> <u>Relief</u> (UMCOR), you may not immediately think of education.

While UMCOR is not involved in the daily teaching of children, the relief agency is strengthening education around the world in many different ways. Your gifts on <u>UMCOR Sunday</u> enable UMCOR to construct classrooms, school latrines, and provisions to collect and store fresh water in Haiti, Sudan and the Democratic Republic of the Congo,

among other places. That is because UMCOR goes to people in crisis and helps them in the ways that meet the community's needs.

UMCOR contributes classroom and sports equipment, desks and other school furnishings, often in partnership with other international or government humanitarian organizations.


