United Methodist Karios Response

(Answering the urgent call from Palestinian Christians)

In October 2010, United Methodist clergy and laity from around the United States came together in a grass roots effort to respond to the "Kairos Palestine Document." This document is an urgent plea from Christians in the Holy Land for decisive action in support of a just peace. It is a powerful call to churches around the world to go beyond merely talking about peace and take real steps to help bring a just peace to the people of Israel and Palestine.

Carol and Hank, CUMC members, will give a historical background of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the United Methodist Karios Response (UMKR) focus on Education, U.S. Policy, Responsible Tourism, Boycott, and Divestment.

The UMKR movement includes thousands of United Methodists in dozens of annual conferences throughout the United Methodist Church, whose goal is to bring about a just peace for Israelis as Well as Palestinians. UMKR also works with allies in many other faith communities and

You may remember that in August, Dave Nuckols, a lay leader and a member of the <u>Commission on a Way Forward</u>, gave us an update on the commission's progress and recommendations at our Third Sunday Forum. This commission was appointed by the Council of Bishops to assist them in their charge from the 2016 General Conference to lead the church forward amid the present impasse related to human sexually and resulting questions about the unity of the church. It will present its report to the Council of Bishops for action at the <u>Special Session</u> of the General Conference February 23–26, 2019 in St. Louis.

In this 4-week study, Rev. Lueck will use *Toward a Faithful United Methodist Witness – Study Guide* to address how the church can be a witness and provide for a diversified human community. Based on a paper by Dr. Charles M. Wood, this resource presents United Methodists an opportunity to think about what has become a cultural and ecclesial flashpoint – human sexuality – and comes out of the conviction that the church is thirsty for theological conversation.

There Is Still Opportunity

As construction on the lower level of our church remodels rooms so that THRIVE, our child care center, can become a reality, it also affects the way the space can be used. With this change our church will no longer be able to host families for Family Promise for a week at a time which requires 6-8 rooms.



Christ UMC has been part of IHN (which is now a division of Family Promise) since it began in Rochester in 2000. We have Building communities, strengthening lives. hosted many families in our church over the years, and IHN

using area churches has hosted every day/night since the first day it began in 2000. Hundreds of adults and children have been helped at a time of crisis in their lives through this non-profit organization.

And the need hasn't lessened. Of the homeless population in our country, children are a major percentage. In our own city at present there are about 380 school age children who do not have an address to call home. This number does not include infant and pre-school children. We hear constantly about the need for affordable housing in Rochester and surrounding area and Family Promise's mission is to provide short term housing and to help families move into long term housing, jobs and support.

The faithful volunteers of CUMC who have worked in this area of ministry have been informed that First Presbyterian Church has offered to take on the weeks we can no longer provide. First Presbyterian understands, however, that it will need volunteer commitment from CUMC and Zumbro Lutheran Church because it does not have enough volunteers to cover the week's schedules. We are going to be able to commit to helping host at First Presbyterian when the weeks are determined, but we would like to have more volunteers.



This information about the future of this important ministry includes an invitation to you to become a volunteer. Can you help set up the rooms, cook a meal, drive a van, host during evening or overnight hours at First Presbyterian? This is only a commitment for a day, four times a year. The rewards of this opportunity are to help homeless families, become acquainted with volunteers from other churches, and know that you are making difference in the lives of homeless adults and children.



SANCTUARY AND IMMIGRANT JUSTICE

At our February 18th Forum, Phil Wheeler presented on Sanctuary action by the Rochester interfaith community. Following are selections from Phil Wheeler's Forum Presentation: 'A sanctuary faith institution provides a safe place to stay for people at risk of deportation, allowing the immigrant (and family) time to arrange matters and their lawyer time to process an appeal. It is not used to shelter criminals'.

'Four faith communities in Rochester, working with ISAIAH of Minnesota (a faith-based social justice organization), have joined dozens across Minnesota and hundreds across the US by declaring themselves to be sanctuary or sanctuary-supporting faith institutions. While each of us has our own faith traditions and principles, we all have reached the same conclusion: the current immigration system, and in particular its treatment of our undocumented immigrant neighbors, is fundamentally immoral.

At CUMC over 30 people indicated they would like to help support this activity. If you would like to be added to this list of Sanctuary Support individuals and/or receive emails and notices, please let one of the following individuals know: Gary Lueck, Mary Schmidt, Larry Segar. These individuals are attending Sanctuary Church Coalition meetings and will help communicate and coordinate CUMC Sanctuary activity.

Schmita Ministry Development Plan



I was selected along with 40 some other MN United Methodist Clergy to be in the first cohort of a new plan for helping to strengthen ministers for long term effectiveness. This process is the result of a new addition to The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church 2016. It calls for an assessment of ministers every seven years. Each Annual Conference designs the process in such a way as to meet the requirements.

We attended a two day retreat along with leaders from Leaderwise in New Brighton. We learned about ourselves and our key relationships. We formed small groups for prayer and support. We also read and discuss 2-3 books on clergy self-care, soul care, and care for relationships. We develop a plan for this coming year in areas we have assessed that need growth.

Part of the Schmita year includes a two week paid sabbatical for furthering our development plan and for strengthening key relationships. I plan to take that time with Chuck this summer.

In September we all meet again to celebrate this special Schmita year.

I am grateful to the MN Annual Conference for having such a strong commitment to strengthen the effectiveness of its clergy. Furthermore, I am thankful for all of you for your generous gifts through our apportionments that provide this enrichment.
