Pastor's Pen with elizabeth macaulay, lead pastor

Blessings to you in this season of Advent.

We are not wired for Advent.

The season of Advent asks us to pay attention to the power of waiting. If we are honest, we admit that waiting can feel like somehow our very important time is being disrespected.

Having to wait for a computer to fire up or a line to move or answers to come is anathema to our want-it-now culture.

How perfect is it that Advent asks us to wait?

During the four weeks of Advent we savor the words of the prophets. We hear about the promise of peace. We hear about the Messiah to come; a savior, come to make us free. Wrapped in the power of winter darkness, we are called to remember the spangle that is hope.

This Advent season we are offering a chance to deck the halls through a service of Hanging of the Greens. We will sing Christmas carols (we generally do not during Advent, because it is Advent, not Christmas! But for this service we will lean toward Christmas), hear the story of why is it poinsettias and other symbols are part of our festooning tradition, and celebrate the wiggle and energy of children as well as the grounded hum of our elders. We will gather at 6:00pm on Sunday the 2nd. Following our time in the sanctuary we will eat cookies and share fellowship.

This is a new thing for us. This gathering is for all generations. Come to make it shine!

We live in a time where hope can sometimes feel hard to come by.

Fires rage, hate crimes snarl, and energies feel far-flung and waning.

And yet.

Promises of the "not yet" are given. The prophet Isaiah speaks of a time when wars will cease. An adolescent Mary says "yes" to giving birth to the hope of the world.

Jesus is promised. Jesus is delivered. Jesus is.

I pray that you are able to savor a gentle Advent season.

I pray that you have times of stillness during which you can breathe deeply. I pray you have spaces in the too-muchness of life.

There will be an electronic Advent devotional coming to your inbox daily. Please be sure we have your email address.

The devotionals are meant to be a bit of hope spangle.

Relish the power of promise.

Forgive yourself for not creating the perfect Christmas. You don't need to. It's already been done.


As we move through November into December, I wanted to pause and thank all of you who have supported Thrive as we opened our doors to our children and families. What an amazing opening it has been!

Sanctuary Church Movement Report

The Sanctuary Church Movement is alive and well in Rochester. This movement is almost a year old, but it takes time and many people to develop plans for sanctuary churches to be in place. CUMC is an active support church in this movement. Peace United Church of Christ and the Unitarian Universalist Church are actual Sanctuary Churches. Below is some information from a recent Sanctuary meeting held at Peace United Church of Christ.

- 1. A need for increasing sanctuary community visibility was recognized. Brochures will be forthcoming with accompanying business cards. The sheriff will make these brochures available at the Detention Center and they will also be distributed to food trucks, IMAA, Immigration Law Center and law offices dealing with immigration.
- 2. A more formal process of accompanying immigrants was discussed and suggestions will be forthcoming.
- 3. The one year anniversary of Sanctuary in Rochester will be celebrated the first Sunday in January. A press conference is a possibility and the UU Church will highlight their opening of a Sanctuary Center.
- 4. The Interfaith Coalition is working through the Diversity Council for fiscal sponsorship of a legal defense fund.



Making the Lighting at CUMC More Energy Efficient

The Trustees have developed a plan and have a budget to replace bulbs throughout the church as they burn out and can be replaced with LED. As new light fixtures are installed, they will be LED. For example, all the lighting in Thrive is LED. Bulbs in the hanging lights in the sanctuary that could be replaced with LED are LED. We have put out for bid to replace the most of the lighting in the altar area with more LED fixtures. The balcony bulbs in the hanging fixtures that can be replaced with LED will also be replaced when the proper scaffolding can be secured. Those attending the Arise Service in the ECC will notice that the first two rows of track lighting now have LED lights. As the can lights through out the church burn out, they will be replaced with LED. We do have a number of ceiling fixtures in the office that will not support LED lights at this time but we are looking at finding alternatives.
