

Children and Youth Ministry Updates

What makes you wonder? Does blue snow and ice have you asking “I wonder why that snow looks blue?” Does reading about Jesus healing a child have you curious about how Jesus heals? Do you wonder how eyes work? These are all questions our children and youth are asking along side the “To Tell the Truth” worship series. Children and youth have an amazing capacity for wonder—they have so much to teach adults.

For kids, belief is often concrete and they want to know what is “true.” Our preschoolers are experiencing the world and wonder through imagination--like artists. Our elementary students are looking at the world like scientists: evidence, repeat. Middle schoolers put ideas together like engineers, high school students want to think philosophically about the same questions. In Sunday school, Club 6-7 and at Kids With Purpose we are in a season of wonder about faith.



2024 Minnesota Legislative Session

Saturday Noon Meals

This year the Saturday Noon Meal program is celebrating their 30th year of serving a warm and nutritious meal to those with food and housing insecurity in Rochester. Our focus and mission remain the same - to provide a worthwhile service to those we serve in a respectful and accepting setting.


We resumed in-person meal service in Wesley hall in November of 2022, after serving meals within the community since March 2020. During 2023 we continued to see growth in the numbers of guests we served each month. We served 3,000 meals at CUMC in 2023. In January 2023 we served a total of 150 guests. This grew to 365 guests during the month of December! With this growth we have experienced the need for additional volunteers and food resources. We essentially have become a very busy restaurant that is open 5 hours per week - typically serving 75 guests a warm homecooked meal at noon each Saturday. We are so thankful for our many volunteers who donate their time and energy each Saturday, for our donations that we receive from CUMC and community members and our community partners.

Our community partners include Rochester People's Co-op, Community Food Response, Red Lobster, Salvation Army, Zumbro Valley Medical Society (socks), Thrift on Fifth (clothing) and Thrive.

We continue to accept food containers, plastic bags, and books. These items can be dropped off in the blue container located near the west door of the church. We are also grateful for additional volunteers.

I come to Christ United Methodist Church by way of North Dakota, New York, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Minnesota...whew! Life is full of zigzags and curves! I grew up in Grand Forks, ND, but I felt a pull to life outside the prairie state and landed in upstate New York, where I attended college. Upon graduation, I worked as a journalist, then taught high school English before I began a long career in higher education, most of which was spent at St. Mary's University in Winona, Minn., where I happily devoted my professional life to ministering to students. Along the way, I earned a PhD., raised a family, and became associated with the La Crosse, WI, Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration as an Affiliate.

Like all human stories, my story involves a wealth of joys and sorrows. My second-half-of-life has been less about building a life and more about being present to life. In response to an inner voice, I began the process of becoming a chaplain, work that for me holds incredible value, meaning, and purpose. For the past three years I've served as chaplain at a senior living facility and as a hospital affiliate chaplain, both in the La Crosse, WI area. As a chaplain, it is a sacred responsibility to bear witness to people's big moments and to help them find meaning in those experiences.

I also consider my new role as Minister of Congregational Care at CUMC to be a sacred and holy one—meant to serve congregants by uplifting them, supporting them, offering them compassion and care, and standing alongside them throughout the zigzags and curves of their own unique life journey.


