It has been a busy few months with lots of great things happening. In March we happily greeted Nikki Gensmer and have been getting her up to speed as our new Team Coordinator. John and Nikki teamed up to host a special team from Paradise Valley, Arizona. It was made even more special when Dr Phil Karsell, his wife and granddaughter joined them. Dr Phil had joined the CUMC YAM team before and will again, so it was nice to begin working with a few familiar faces. It was a great first team for Nikki. 


- Collect gently used children's books from your personal library.

#### Summer Internships at Christ UMC

We have the opportunity here at Christ church to host two interns this summer!



Allison Schwarz, a Psychology Major at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire.

Allison is our intern selected through the Eli Program, through the Minnesota Annual Conference.

From "eliprojectmn.com": The Exploring Leadership Internship (ELI) Project was a pilot initiative of the Minnesota Annual Conference's Board of Ordained Ministry in 2015 to identify, encourage, and support young adults who are exploring a call to ordained ministry.

Through the Exploring Leadership Internship program, or "The ELI Project," up to 10 young adults are selected to participate in a learning experience each summer. After gathering for a week of orientation, which will include a seminary visit, leadership assessments, and an opportunity to learn about the United Methodist Church, each intern will be placed at a host church for eight weeks. Over that period, the host congregation will invite the intern to gain hands-on experience by preaching and/or lead a Bible study or devotional, planning worship, becoming involved in a social justice or community outreach ministry, observing leadership development/discipleship ministry at the host site, and providing pastoral care. By being involved in a wide variety of ministerial contexts, the intern will have a taste-and-see experience of what it really means to be a pastor at a local church.

The internships are for a ten-week period, beginning with an intern/mentor meeting day, May 24 then, group orientation from May 29 to June 1, followed by the nine-week on-site internship (June 3 August 5), and then a wrap-up retreat Sunday, August 5 - Tuesday, August 7 that includes group reflection, evaluation, and celebration.



Grace Glover, (recent!!) graduate of Beloit College in Wisconsin.

Grace's family are members here at Christ UMC; she and her mother Shelly (who attends the 11 am Arise service) participated in the YAM Guatemala 2017 trip. She is applying for outside grant money to work with our church, most specifically with Thrive!, this summer. She is interested in our work as a church mostly through the non -profit and community development perspective.

These wonderful women will be helping with many things this summer:

-Building up and supporting our children's environmentally-centered VBS

- Rochesterfest booth June 20th for the Families night
- -Work with VBS, the Boundary Waters trip, Sunday worship, Young Adult activities and small groups, as well as with mission and outreach opportunities throughout the summer.
- -Grace will work with Tanya Goretzki with community outreach and research to help build the Thrive! network and strengthen the program for the fall launch.

#### A thrift store morning.....

One comes in and has a bad cold. He is careful to stay at a distance from everyone so as not to make others sick. It's been a cold week even though it's May and he's been living on the street. He finds a jacket and hands over some of his last bits of change. One of the thrift store volunteers has been bringing in books for him because he loves to read. These are free. With wise and sincere eyes he says thank you.

Another comes in looking well except for a gash on his forehead he got from a fight. He has money and gives \$20 to the man that just bought the jacket. The jacket man starts to tell him why he's so low on money but the man with the money and gash says no you don't need to explain.....I get it.

They go to lunch.

A third comes in and leans against the table. He suffered a broken foot several weeks ago. One of the thrift store volunteers says she remembers and that he wore a supportive boot for awhile. He says thank you. She has validated his pain. He thanks God that he has a good heavy pair of shoes to walk in but it still hurts to walk.

The man with the jacket and books comes back and asks if we can make change for his \$20 bill. We do and he hands over \$5 of it to the man with the healing foot who looks at him with gratitude. "You know what this means to me? It means 10 bus passes and not having to walk on some days that my foot really hurts."

He spends \$1 on a great pair of jeans that fit him well. "I like to put on clean clothes in the morning."

The thrift store has made \$2 for Thrive but that doesn't really tell the story entirely. And what a blessing it is to be in the midst of this.
