Pastor's Pen with elizabeth macaulay, lead pastor

"What kindnesses are you blessed with day by day, and what kindnesses do you offer your world?"

I am at taking in the goodness of learning and loving in community.

Carrie Newcomer is one of my favorite songwriters. She sings the every day apprehensions of beauty as well as the longings for healing in this tumultuous day in which we live. I am a huge fan.

And, I get to be in her good company for three days. I sat next to her today at lunch. I tried to be cool, even as I wanted to (and of course, did) ask her many questions about who is writing (besides the work that she does) songs that have the power to move hearts toward resistance, and hope. She named authors she is collaborating with: Parker Palmer, Barbara Kingsolver, and she named some other songwriters and composers. We agreed that the power of communal song is one of the precious gifts that Christian community can provide, and that such gifts need to be celebrated and made new and fresh.

Carrie led us in our own writing processes. Some of the exercises are so simple: What did you see today? What caught your attention? Tell about that.

Together we also did an exercise that asked us to name two kindnesses offered us, and one we offered to another.

Carrie said that "love" is such a big word, so grandiose in its scope, that we can lose the particularities of how it is we practice love.

So she asked us to consider kindness as the lived practice of love.

Well now. Think on these things, community in Christ.

What are you paying attention to in your own life?

What kindnesses are you blessed with day by day, and what kindnesses do you offer your world?

The questions are holy. Living into the asking and answering of those questions is the stuff of Spirit living.

It is our call.

This month is dense with life. We are celebrating the witness and kindness of Pat Scoggin. She and her husband the Rev. Dr. Bob Scoggin brought to Christ Church the gift of communal song and the goodness of being a choir of humans in the service of a loving God. Pat's celebration of life is May 19th at 2:00 PM.

We'll also be celebrating the new voices brought to faith through Confirmation at our church. On May 13th at the 9:00 service we will name our gratitude for the faith song being entered by those being confirmed.

And then, some of us will gather at Annual Conference (the yearly gathering of United Methodists from throughout the state) for a time of worship and ordination.

Two things about that:

Our own Katy Lee is being ordained as an Elder at Annual Conference this year - on Friday at 2:00 PM in St Cloud - and our Arise! worship band is leading worship for three days. The whole state will be led by our musicians. Why? Because they are gifted musicians who sing God's song for this time while honoring what has gone before.

So. Pay attention to your life. Name your blessings. Sing your song. Come to church. Give and receive kindness.

Thank you for loving me and displaying charity at an exceedingly difficult and challenging time. Many




back home in Michigan celebrate this opportunity we've had to experience God's grace through you and express Thanks as well.

An Update from your Church Safety Team

The Church Safety Team has completed the Church's emergency procedures for Severe Weather, Fire, Medical Emergency, Bomb Threat, Assault/ Fight, and Intruder/Active Shooter. The Fire Marshall, police, local, state and national agencies provided guidelines for us to develop our procedures.

In April and May, training will take place for staff, ushers, Sunday school teachers, and other church volunteers in regards to the new emergency procedures. Training will include procedures on evacuating the building based on various emergencies. Emergency procedure posters will be placed in all classrooms and other areas of the church. A forum will be held in the sanctuary for all church members later this spring to go over emergency and evacuation procedures. Various scenarios will be reviewed. Examples will be provided so everyone will know where to relocate to in case of a fire or inclement weather. Sunday school classes will also be taught evacuation procedures for their classroom. A planned fire drill for Sunday school students will be conducted this spring.

Walkie-talkies have been purchased for communication between the ushers, office, Church Safety Team, Sunday school area, church volunteers, and the custodians. They will be used during church services, so please don't be alarmed when you see someone with an earpiece and a radio within the sanctuary or elsewhere in the building. This is for everyone's safety. Earpieces will be used so noise will not be an issue.

In addition, large white numbers will be placed on all of the outside doors per the fire marshal request. This will provide a precise location for emergency personnel.

The Church Safety Team is looking for additional volunteers. Please contact a team member if interested. We also welcome questions and/or concerns you may have.

CUMC Sanctuary Support Help Needed

An April 2nd Sanctuary Coalition meeting was held to organize volunteer support for both the Peace UCC Sanctuary facility and the Unitarian Church facility.

Mary Schmidt will coordinate CUMC volunteer signup for training and activation when sanctuary support is needed. There are two areas of training that are scheduled to occur on May 7th at Peace UCC church:

- 1. At 6PM instructors from ISAIAH (https://isaiahmn.org/) will train Sanctuary volunteers on interfacing with ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) and other situations when staying in a Sanctuary Church with the immigrant individual or family. This is applicable to both of our two Rochester Sanctuary Churches. The Peace UCC Sanctuary Facility will be toured and specific volunteer needs within this facility taught. At a later date, a tour of the Unitarian facility will take place.
- 2. At 7PM instructors will conduct a class on Rapid Response Teams. These are individuals that will quickly go to any ICE action arresting or detaining an immigrant and record cell phone or other video and take notes of what takes place. In doing so, it provides deterrent to excessive force by ICE and provides legal documentation.

We encourage individuals from CUMC to sign-up with Mary Schmidt (oronocombs@yahoo.com or call 507-258-7460) to attend either or both of these training sessions.

Since often the children are US citizens, there will also be needs for food, driving of family members to school, medical appointments etc. In addition to the training that is necessary to be in contact with the Sanctuary family, criminal background checks and photos are needed to assure the right individual is reporting or volunteering. For the safety of the Sanctuary family, all individuals that will participate will need this training, background check and photo. So, if your spouse will also be staying with or in contact with the Sanctuary family, both of you will need the training, background check and photo on record.

Mary Schmidt will arrange with the CUMC office for CUMC volunteers to obtain the photos and background checks if not all ready on record and coordinate sharing these records with the two Sanctuary Churches. Please notify her ASAP of your intent to attend either or both of these training sessions.

At the April 2nd meeting we heard that there are 89 cases involving ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) and another 14 people in detention from Olmsted County. The March 19th issue of Time magazine has an article 'Bye Dad, I Love You' that shows the US has 5.9 million children that are US Citizens under the age of 18 living with an undocumented family member. These children are just one group of the 11 million undocumented immigrants that need help.

Please sign up for the training.

Our regular mission/justice meeting will be May 7th at 6 pm! Join us, if you are not at the "sanctuary church" training!

Christian Responses to Gun Violence

Kim Norton and Anjali Goradia

How do we, as citizens of God's kingdom and members of our society, respond to the increasing escalation of gun violence? Two advocates of reasonable gun control policies will speak at the Forum about their efforts.

Kim Norton, former member of the Minnesota House of Representatives, introduced legislation to reduce gun availability in her last of five terms. Kim is a long time public servant with experience working on the Rochester School Board and in numerous civic and educational organizations. She resides in Rochester with her spouse, Randy Stone, and has a family of four children, a step-son and two grandchildren.

Anjali Goradia is a junior at Century High School and one of the leaders of the local student movement to curb gun violence. She was a key organizer and speaker for the student March For Our Lives. Anjali presents a message of optimism and hope for change. "Now we are going to see change because we finally have the country's attention," Goradia said. "We are no longer whining teenagers ... We have the power to decide what happens and who makes those decisions. We are the next generation of voters."





Notes from Pastor Nancy

When You or a Loved One Is a Patient at Mayo Clinic Hospital

We would be happy to visit you if you would like a Pastor or Parish Minister to come. Please note that Mayo has announced a new way for us to know you would like a visit.

With the new electronic medical record, you are now able to register your desire for us to know you are a patient (inpatient only). During the registration process at Mayo Hospital (St Marys or Methodist) please tell them you are a member of Christ United Methodist in Rochester.

We will call the chaplaincy department daily, give them our special code, and they will tell us who is in the hospital. If you do not wish for us to know you are there, simply decline that option at registration.

Note that if you want us to be able to know you are a patient, each time you are admitted you will need to indicate your membership. This is a change from the former chaplains list, where once you were registered as a United Methodist, it stayed that way for every hospital stay. Also, you need to tell them Christ UMC Rochester, not just United Methodist.

We are not able to find out if you are a patient at the Generose building, at Olmsted Medical Hospital, or in Mayo Hospice unless you or a loved one tells us.

We are happy to call on our constituent members and our guests from other places.

You are invited to celebrate Memorial Day with the Dedication of the Memorials and Living Gifts on Sunday May 27. We are so grateful to all those who have enabled many ministries to receive gifts for such diverse projects from refurbishment of the handbells to new chairs and tables for Sunday school.
