Rest as Resurrection

Rest is a dream made real. A portal. A trusting place. A sacred refuge.

Our All Church Read this spring is the book "Rest is Resistance: A Manifesto" by Tricia Hersey. One of the title pages simply reads "I hope you are reading this while laying down!" Tricia Hersey is founder of The Nap Ministry, an organization that examines rest as a form of resistance and often refers to herself as the "Nap Bishop." She advocates for the power of rest in dismantling some of the most toxic forces in our society: grind culture, white supremacy, a relentless drive to consume and accumulate wealth.

While many of us have been taught to believe that we have to continually prove our worth and work ourselves into exhaustion for the sake of "productivity," Hersey insists that to simply be and exist in our bodies is not only a right but an expression of our sacred worth as part of God's creation. And particularly for our BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) siblings, the ability to simply exist in their bodies in particular spaces has not always been allowed, much less celebrated.

Even in different stages of life when patterns of work and rest may change, it's clear that we are collectively weary people. And simply surviving or getting through the day should not be our goal. We were created to love, create, laugh, play, rest and share. And rest is a powerful form of liberation that invites us into sustainable, creative, imaginative life together. It's truly a form of resurrection, God's new creation coming into life here and now. And the four sections of Hersey's book lay out some of the framework for how we can each embrace and embody this practice. They are Rest!, Dream!, Resist!, and Imagine!

While you may be challenged by some of her writing, I hope you'll consider reading this book with us and holding an open heart and mind to the pain and the promise that Tricia Hersey is naming. I believe she invites us to a spiritual practice of rest that is both personal and an expression of resurrection hope. It is something that our weary world is longing to hear. And in this Eastertide season we proclaim the good news not only with our lips but with our bodies. Christ is risen! And so are we!

Finance Report-1st Quarter 2023

- * These results include unrealized net gains of \$9,129 from our investments with the Dakota-Minnesota UMC Foundation. Excluding these, Total Income would be \$322,354 and Net Income \$44,078.
- ** The budget anticipated higher contributions in the beginning of the year, a review of past giving patterns indicates that our the expectation for the full year is still valid.

Assets and Liabilities

At the end of March, the church had cash and other marketable assets of \$968,064 of which \$661,269 was unrestricted, enough to fund 6.4 months of budgeted expenses. Our objective is to be between 3 and 6 months.

Liabilities were \$306,765 of which \$292,745 were in restricted accounts contributed by the congregation for specific missions and projects. The largest of these include:

\$54,661 in the Makinen Bequest account. The Makinen Bequest provided the seed money from which Thrive! arose, what remains may be used as the Leadership Board and congregation determine our needs.

\$48,417 in bequests received by the church and controlled by the Trustees. Because of their restrictions they have been placed with the CUMC Foundation for management. The Foundation's total portfolio at the end of March (the last month for which data is available) was \$696,173.

\$28,276 to be used by the Leadership Board as they assess future needs.

\$15,616 in the Saturday Noon Meals account.

\$18,993 for UMCOR, this will be distributed in April.

\$15,598 for Music Ministry

The church has no long-term debt.

At the end of March, \$10,065 was available for distribution to THRIVE in April.



Pre-Registration with Pastor Nancy is encouraged. Treats will be served.


We invite singles, couples and families to consider Lay Visitor Ministry and Lay Caller Ministry to persons who are homebound.

Our homebound members and friends are living in homes, senior residences and care facilities. They have been ushers, choir members, Sunday school teachers, youth group leaders and ministry team members. They want to hear about what's happening at their church. They may also wish to visit about current events, the weather, the Twins, the Vikings or other interests. Some of our members like to receive communion, a prayer shawl or the Upper Room.

Lay Visitors have training so that they have the knowledge of how to make an effective caring visit. We discuss the biblical basis for making visits. We discuss how to provide spiritual support by means of prayer, holy listening, and sharing interests. We meet together a few times a year to share experiences and to continue to learn about visiting. Lay visitors sometimes visit one person while others choose to visit several. We ask lay visitors to visit at least once a month. Many help with the Flower Ministry after Easter and Christmas. A background check and Safe Sanctuary training are required.

We currently have about one hundred homebound members. Most live in Rochester. There are six lay visitors and four lay callers. The callers make phone calls and have the same training as lay visitors.

We will also find out what items should or should not be placed in the curbside garbage bins and recycling carts.


