

The pastors of Christ UMC and the Caring Ministires Team wish to thank all of the staff and volunteers who helped to make this celebration so special.



What is Hopeful Earth at Christ United Methodist Church?

Recognizing the urgency for Creation Care, it's a group of people interested in sharing ideas and experiences related to Creation Care.



What does that mean?

All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings (words right out of the United Methodist Social Principles).

Do I have to attend meetings?

No, but, to change the church practices, utility practices and government practices, showing up is at times very valuable. Christ Church is using less toxic cleaners, no pesticides or herbicides outside, has native prairie plantings and has done various lighting and energy efficiency projects. Individuals have done similar things at home. Attending meetings is sometimes an opportunity to learn new things. Our goal is Creation Care, not attending meetings. Sharing your experience is valuable to others.

Aren't there already people working on these things?

Yes, but it's a big planet, with lots of people, and lots of things to do. The phrase "Be the change that you would like to see" is quite applicable.

Do you have a logo, and how will we identify Hopeful Earth activities?

We do not have a logo.....yet. Hopeful Earth is our identity.

When do you meet?

Our CUMC group meets the second Sunday of the month at 10:15am in the library, but sometimes we need to show support for community efforts and those ties and places vary.

What's the minimum I need to do?

Hospital Visits

If someone you love is in the hospital, please know that the pastors and our hospital lay visitors are glad to visit, if requested! You need to call and let us know the name of the person and where they are hospitalized. We do not have access to the Chaplain's List and have no way of knowing someone is hospitalized unless you call us.

We provide a listening ear and a supportive atmosphere for discussion. It is a place where you can experience the comfort of others living with the same condition and the comfort of faith.



The New Congregational Care Team

Pastor Nancy is meeting with members of a new care team, Parish Ministers. These members will be providing care to members and friends of Christ UMC who are undergoing a life crisis. They will undergo an extensive training process including topics of listening, grief and loss, ministry with the sick, providing spiritual support, prayer and more. Please pray for those who are called to be parish ministers and for those who will be served.

Update from the Memorials and Living Gifts Committee

This committee met in early August to review the requests for funds from undesignated memorials and living gifts. The total amount of undesignated gifts was approximately \$17,000. We received seven requests. Those writing the requests were asked to name what the item was, the ministry area requesting, the contact name, how it would be used, other areas that might be affected by the request, and how it would further the mission and vision of CUMC. Lastly, an estimate of cost was to be submitted. All requests were granted. The projects include: 6 tables to be used in the Sunday School rooms, a riding lawn mower, percussion instruments and movement props for the Little Angels choir, start-up cost for a thrift shop in Room 9 on the lower level, replacement of 64 folding chairs and 8 tables for use around the building, new choral music, a video screen and wiring for the Hamline Room, and also one in the Sunday School room. The funding of these requests was \$11,125.00.

Forms for requests for funds from the undesignated memorials and living gifts are available in the front office. Our next committee meeting will be November 9th. We will once again review requests from undesignated gifts.

Budget Reports from Dick Estry

Through July pledge, regular giving and loose offering are ahead of budget, as is revenue from other sources. Expenses are below budget. Mission commitments are up to date, including apportionments and our support for the Lage family in Guatemala.

<u>Budget Comparison:</u> Through July, revenue exceeded budget by \$23,595.15 (3.6%) and expenses were under budget by \$43,652.59 (6.8%). Net income was \$79,206.64, which exceeded budget by \$67,247.78

Assets and Liabilities: At the end of July, the church had cash assets of \$1,151,690.49, of which \$778,852.84 were in restricted accounts among others. We had current liabilities of \$21,044.65 which is fairly typical for the end of any month, leaving unrestricted assets of \$351,793.30. This equals about 4 months of operating expenses which is a prudent but not excessive reserve. We have no long-term debt. Complete financial statements are available in the office.
