



For a society that is often oriented around the school calendar, each May brings a flurry of "end of year" activities. Recitals, celebrations, graduations and ceremonies have become so prevalent in this month that it's now jokingly referred to as "Maycember," hearkening back to the busyness of the holiday season. While we certainly have our share of Maycember activities in our household, I've always particularly loved the way this time is shaped in the church year. May usually carries us from the Easter season into the celebration of Pentecost. And at CUMC that includes our own passages and celebrations such as Children's Worship, Rochester Pride, Ascension Sunday, Confirmation, Annual Conference and the final weeks of Sunday School, music rehearsals and CU Wednesday gatherings. This May we'll also remember and give thanks for the life of Rev. Ted Colescott who died at the beginning of 2024, and whose memorial service will so fittingly take place on Pentecost weekend in our church.

It's a full and joyful season, but lest we get carried away with all "busyness," I hope that May also brings ample time for us to pause and take in. Even in Minnesota, spring is upon us and there are endings and beginnings unfolding all around, in the natural world and in these rituals of time and experience that have become so engrained in our life together. I am profoundly grateful to be part of communities where we mark and remember with intention. And where growth and loss and new birth and possibility are all lifted up as part of the sacred rhythms of creation.

In many ways it reminds me of the hope we celebrate in the incarnation- God's indwelling in humanity calling us to an awareness of the sacred both in heaven and on earth. I think I feel a carol coming on....Happy Maycember everyone!

When I was eight years old, I moved with my family into an aging blonde brick duplex situated kittycorner from a large cemetery in the poor part of town. The cemetery's wrought iron fence acted as a shield against curious onlookers and mischievous youth, and its gargoyle gate seemed to silently scream "beware." The cemetery's overgrown trees created an atmosphere of hushed foreboding. I was petrified.

My new best friend Julie lived just blocks away—on the other side of the cemetery in a modern home with a piano, shag carpeting, and a ping-pong table in the basement. So whenever Julie invited me over after school, I jumped at the chance—even though it meant facing that menacing cemetery on my way home.

I was so terrified I often sprinted past, my legs chugging, my heart wildly pumping, my mind racing with thoughts of my capture and torture. Such is the imaginative mind of a child.

But something changed one late sunlit afternoon. In my fear, the sunshine cast down on me a warm embrace that seemed to still my distress, and I began to sing to God, to the Universe, to whatever it was in that moment that made me feel I was important, I belonged, that I was loved. It was as if the words and melody acted as a salve that blanketed my fear, a caress that calmed my soul and helped me see that my outsized fear of the cemetery was really my outsized fear of life. After losing my father at a young child, I regarded life, with its vast ability to cut down and harm without warning, as an uncaring foe, an adversary capable of capture and torture.

I began to understand that in the midst of my deep fear of loss, there could exist something beyond fear-trust. Trust that God-the Unknown-knew me, deeply and fully. Trust that in life's immensity, I had not been forgotten. Trust that I held a place that mattered alongside all of Creation.

Over four decades later, the paralyzing fear I felt as a child returned when I learned that my mother's health had taken a critical turn. During one particularly sleepless night at the hospital I found myself walking the eerily quiet hallways. The echo of my footsteps sounded so ominous I began to believe I was being followed by an evil person intent on harming me. The same childhood emotions bubbled up—my mind racing, my heart wildly pumping—and I sprinted back to the safety of my mother's hospital room and curled up in the recliner next to her bed. I instinctively voiced to my mother, who was clinging to life—"It's okay, Mom. I'm not afraid."

My mother knew, even when I didn't, that I would struggle without her, that I would yearn for her touch, her voice, her presence. My panic over an evil person intent on harming me was the manifestation of my overwhelming fear that her loss would be too much to bear. A few hours later, my mother died.

I'm more self-aware now, able to notice the red flags that indicate fear. They caution me most fervently when I'm facing a new challenge or a potential loss. When we are afraid, we tend to isolate ourselves, as though life's burdens are uniquely ours to shoulder. We feel farthest from Love in those moments. Yet it is when we are most in need that we can rely on Love to see us through. I've learned that life—with all its sadness, hurts, challenges, and surprises—is never ours to face alone.


Vacation Bible School will be August 5-9 from 9:00-11:45am. Registration begins on May 5.
